

New director of Connect2 Leah Davidowitz heads program

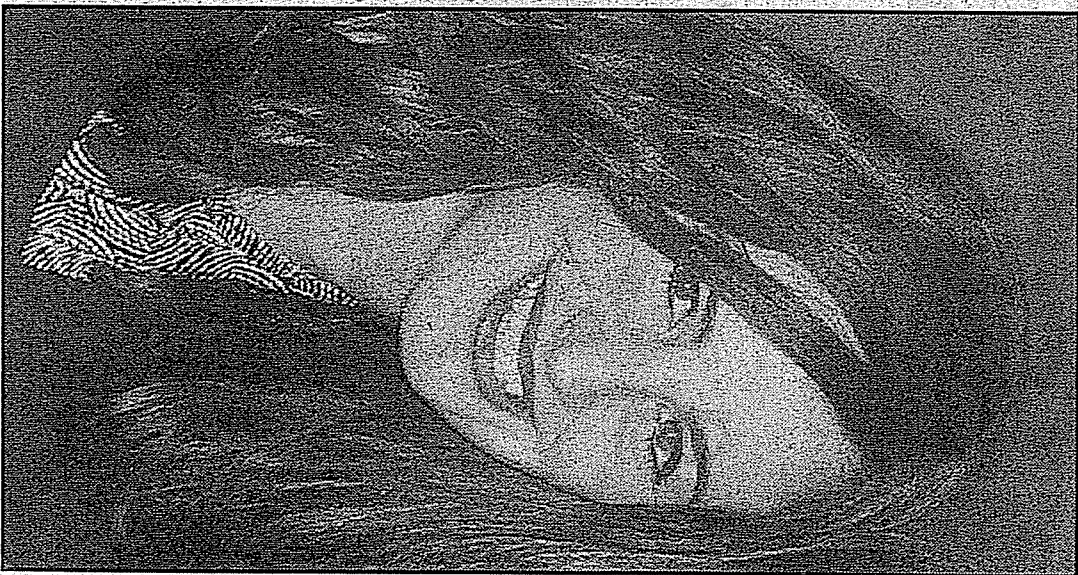

Davidowitz, who is completing her Masters of Social Work (MSW) degree, has extensive experience in organizing and training volunteers, most recently at the Jewish Board of Family and Children's Services where she helped direct and coordinate

their "Helpline" and "Jewish Connections" "Bikur Cholim" (visiting the sick) programs.

"Connect2," which offers home visitation to Holocaust survivors throughout Brooklyn and Manhattan through a unique volunteer network, has provided over 5,000 such visits since its initiation in 2001. We look forward to Leah's leadership as "Connect2" expands and develops further.
